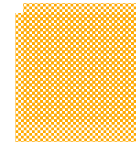
This address was once a rubble strewn vacant lot, a magnet for crime and trash. After lengthy negotiations with the city, it was turned over to SJNA with the provision that it be maintained for the benefit of the community. With the help CDBG grants and volunteers the arbor, walkways, furnishings and garden plots were created. The centerpiece was the addition and refurbishment of an historic Rosenberg Fountain. The Garden has now become a point of pride for our neighborhood, a gathering place for picnics, and a place to share our skills, knowledge, and interest in gardening.

The Lost Bayou Historic District

Loat Bayou is an Historic District designation created in 1994 within the San Jacinto neighborhood. It encompasses the area between 16th and 21st Streets, Ave K through Ave M1/2. In 2004 the block of Ave N1/2 between 20th and 21st Streets was also added. This entire area was once covered by a body of water called Hitchcock's Bayou, which was filled in and thus "lost" when the island was raised after the 1900 Storm. Most of this area was developed as a working class community, with a smattering of grand houses and estates. What remains is an extraordinary sampling of homes which include Greek Revival, Italianate, Arts & Crafts, and Folk Victorian preserved from the late 1800's and early 20th century. Also in evidence are many corner stores dating from the turn of the century, before the advent of the automobile. Many of these buildings and others within San Jacinto have been featured on the Annual Historic Homes Tour.
